You can find used copies for about \$6. If you want to pool resources and share copies, that's fine. You do NOT have to own your own as long as you can access one over the summer. Sadly, Baltimore County Public Libraries do not own any.
- 2. Please read any FOUR studies but each must come from a DIFFERENT chapter (each chapter deals with a different theoretical perspective).
- 3. In google classroom, please submit your summary of EACH study. Your responses should be about 1-2 paragraphs. You must answer all of the questions below in detail. PLEASE LABEL THE TITLE OF EACH STUDY.
 - a. Who was the researcher and what aspect of human behavior was he interested in?
 - b. Summarize the methods used in the study
 - c. Summarize the results of the study.
 - d. Discuss ONE example of the significance of the study or ONE criticism directed toward the research.
 - e. What did you learn? How did this study improve your understanding of psychology? Explain.
 - Grading: Your responses will be graded on clarity of thought, quality of ideas, and completeness (Do your comments reflect a thorough reading of the article? Did you address all of the questions asked above?). You will need to write in complete sentences for each of the above questions.
